







But Why? What's wrong with the card?

- 60% of thefts from motor vehicles are blue badge thefts*
- Blue badge thefts have quadrupled in last 5 years**
- Targets vulnerable people with disabilities
 - Loss of independence
 - Repair Costs/Insurance Excess Payment
 - Increase in insurance premiums



Would you leave £6000** on your dashboard?


What do disabled drivers think?

- Current badge is too big
 - Great for display in the window
 - Poor for carrying about
- Often left at home or another car
 - Not having the badge is a problem for independence
- Forgot to put the badge in the window
 - When you have mobility problems, having to go back can be a challenge



So just use your phone!

- Nothing valuable left in the car
 - Nothing for anyone to steal
- Always have it with you
 - Not left at home or other car
- It's in your pocket
 - Not another big thing to carry
 - Especially with the amount of other things disabled people need to carry/remember



Everything is on your phone today

How it works

Register your badge



Enter the car you are in



Select use blue badge



What about non-smartphone or app users?

- Not everyone has a smartphone (but they will)
- Older users may not be comfortable using an app
- Interactive Voice System can be used
- Tied to the drivers mobile phone number to authenticate them



"Please say your vehicles registration number"

"A B 1 7 X Y Z"

"Thank you, please call back when you return to your vehicle"

Behind the scenes

- Registering the badge validates it with the Blue Badge Improvement Service.
- Only a single phone can be registered at any time.
- When using the app the badge is recorded as being in-use on the vehicle with the registration number entered.
- Anyone wanting to verify the vehicle is using a blue badge can go to http://bluebadgeapp.org and enter the registration of the car.
 - It will simply say if a blue badge is being used on the car at that time

Showing a blue badge

- Let everyone know a blue badge is being used
 - Need to show it's a disabled driver to stop people thinking the parking space is being abused
- Indicate to officials its using the blue badge app
 - and how to verify it
- Blue Badge cards could be foldable or vinyl so they are easily carried
 - or have multiple, as they are only valid when the app has registered their use





Physical Badges

- Instead of the large badge, everyone who wants to use the app could be issued with a smaller credit card sized badge.
- A credit card sized badge wouldn't need to be displayed, just kept in your purse or wallet.
- The card could have an embedded chip* for easy registration or require scanning every time to defeat double use








How to deal with enforcement

- Web, App or API
 - Could be publically available as all it checks is the registration number and says yes or no
 - Lets private parking companies validate as well as public
 - API allows for easy integration with existing systems







How can you stop multiple use?

- Only allow registration to a single phone at a time
- If someone tries to register to another phone, you can send a text message to the registered phone number to warn or stop it being moved.
- An alternative would be to not use with the existing blue badges and only credit card sized badges with NFC chips.
 - You could ask them to scan the card every time they used it. This would make sure they had the card with them.



Ending the session

- Ask the user to enter the time at the start
- Have a maximum time when its automatically stopped
 - Alert the user before it expires and ask if still needed
- Use GPS to match the parking location and automatically stop at the maximum allowed time
- Automatically end at midnight
- For multi-day parking require the user to specify the location
 - or automatically get from the phone at time of parking

Lots of options depending on policy required

What about European Travel?

- I travel abroad, what do I do then?
 - You should be able to apply for a separate blue badge in a similar format to the existing.
 - It can be marked with "NOT FOR USE IN THE UK" or similar to stop people using it when they return home.
 - This has the disadvantage of requiring people to request another badge, or it could be automatically issued when people get a credit card sized badge.



No network service

- How would this work in areas of poor network coverage, such as underground car parks?
 - The app continues in the background to register the parking so that will send the parking information as soon as connectivity is restored.
 - After 10 minutes if it still hasn't sent the information it will sound an alarm on the phone to let the user know.
 - The will then be able to press a button to send the request via an SMS text message.




I'm happy and don't want this

- If you are happy then there is no need to change.
- Just carry on using your existing blue badge.
- Please remember others do want this, having a choice will benefit everyone.

Existing cards and app based can live together

Case Study: London Borough of Tower Hamlets

- 60% of Thefts from motor vehicles (TFMVs) are of blue badges
- 279 Thefts last year
